	<p>The group reported the following upcoming announcements and activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• NCTTRAC – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The Board of Directors voted to let E*TRACS expire and begin a phase out utilizing similar tools in WebEOC and EMResource.</li> <li>○ There will be an Operational Hazmat course in August and a BDLS/ADLS course in October.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• DSHS – HSR 2/3 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ There will be an upcoming radiation exercise with Dallas County on August 24th. The morning will consist of training and the exercise will be in the afternoon.</li> <li>○ There will be a mass fatality response exercise in Rockwall County during the “Big X” Full Scale Exercise facilitated through the NCTCOG. There are opportunities for hospital play including active shooter, bomb threats, and radiation scenarios. The exercise will be held on November 11<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup>.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Baylor – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ There will be a 3 day CDP HERT course held at the DFR Academy from October 25<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup>. <b>3.1 HVA's</b>	Kaitlyn Cross has reported that DMOC has received HVAs from Baylor, UTSW, Childrens, VA, Parkland, Dallas Presby, and Baylor Rehab. Still awaiting Methodist, Medical City, and a couple others. In draft form and will be presented soon.	Kaitlyn Cross	Send reminder email.
<b>3.2 DMOC Activities</b>	Kaitlyn Cross reported that DMOC had several requests for liaisons this month. DMOC sent a liaison to the City of Dallas EOC for the Trump Rally, on July 7 <sup>th</sup> for the DPD shooting event, on July 11 <sup>th</sup> for a rally/memorial, and July 12 <sup>th</sup> for the POTUS visit. The group noted that the shooting event involved both Parkland and Baylor, tying up all three DMOC officers. DMOC would like to develop an on call list of potential DMOC representatives that can help fill this roll during a large scale event.	Kaitlyn Cross	Add to agenda and continue to provide update.
<b>3.3 Zika</b>	Julie Martellini reported that they are separating human cases and pregnant women cases. Zika prevention kits for pregnant women have been developed. DCHHS is working with the Mexican consulates for distribution, following New York's distribution plans, as well as area hospital infection prevention departments.	DCHHS	Continue to provide update.
<b>3.4 NCTTRAC Presentation</b>	Thomas Stidham provided a presentation on the new bed tracking tools in EMResource and the patient tracking boards in WebEOC. These tools are still in development and NCTTRAC will be pushing out period training, both in person and online. Work flow conversations are also being discussed on the first Tuesday of every month at the Crisis Applications and Communications Workgroup (CACOM). <b>3.5 DCHHS Activity</b>	<p>Renee Owusu-Ansah reported the following recap of the disaster mental health response for the Dallas shooting:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ACS crisis hotline is open to everyone impacted including all DPD officer and family member and providing referrals and linkages to follow-up services as needed</li> <li>• MetroCare is providing clinical services free to anyone impacted</li> <li>• DPD Psych Services along with their partner resource (including Assist the Officer/ATO) are handling DPD officer, staff, and family members</li> <li>• UNT Dallas's Community Counseling Center is providing services for the El Centro students and for impacted communities as needed</li> <li>• MH professionals will be deploying to the patrol stations weekly</li> </ul>		

	<p>(date TBD by DPD Psych Services)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MHA w/ help from Haliburton has developed a roster of MH professionals that are willing to assist with this effort and to assist with surge needs</li> <li>• MetroCare staff, MRC volunteers, and Red Cross volunteers are also on standby alert with a weekly scheduling roster to assist as well</li> <li>• Requests for additional MH volunteers have gone out to the North Texas Behavioral Health Authority and NORTHSTAR/Beacon Health Options networks as well</li> <li>• There have been two meetings to discuss short and long term planning effort for the 3 priority groups: 1) DPD officers and family members 2) El Centro students and demonstrators and 3) general public</li> </ul>
